# MARIACHI YOUTH ACADEMY

In February of 2009, The Sinfonia Mexicana established the Mariachi Youth Academy. We have been in existence for four years now and the Academy is operating at its full design. Currently we have approximately 70 students in all three levels.

Beginner classes are designed for students that have no prior musical knowledge. These classes are for students eight years and older. The only requirements for beginners are: a desire to learn music/mariachi, complete their homework/assignments and practice, and practice. Beginner students do not start playing any instruments until they pass several tests that insure they have learned basic music fundamentals and theory. They also start with the basics on knowledge of their instruments and singing.

Intermediate classes are for students that have passed all beginner classes and testing or they can show through an evaluation by our instructors that they meet our minimum requirements of music fundamentals and knowledge of their instrument. Intermediate students also begin learning about Mariachi history and culture.

Advance/Performing level students must pass all the intermediate requirements, testing and/or pass an audition/evaluation by at least two of our instructors. Advance students continue learning more advanced music fundamentals and theory, and complex music scores are taught. Singing as soloists, harmonizing and group singing is continually refined, and showmanship and stage presence is also part of the instruction. Advance/Performing level students are constantly being challenged to higher levels of achievements.

Ultimately, our goal is to continually challenge the student at their individual learning curve and experience. If a student can pass all the minimum requirements for the next level the student is moved up. In the same respect, if a student is struggling to keep up, instructors can move a student back down or have them attend both classes.

At every level, the Academy's directors, instructors and board continually stress the importance of continued education. To reinforce this goal, our Academy staff and Sinfonia Board Members have established a scholarship fund specifically for our students. Last year, we awarded several thousand dollars to our students that are college/university bound.

The Mariachi Youth Academy's Mission is to establish a continuing and comprehensive course of study that will challenge and enhance the student's ability to read music, master their instruments and enhance stage presence. Our program instills responsibility, discipline and stresses the advantages of a college education.

Along with our excellent instructors and the extraordinary support of our Board members, sponsors and parents, the Mariachi Youth Academy is set on a path of success. I believe the Academy's mission is definitely on track and we are continually working on a long-term commitment of education and culture to our youth and our community.
